*5.2 Matters for Discussion*

The group welcomed the proposal and noted that the programme was aimed at the niche market of people who want to study transnational crime. Course options are shared with the proposed MSc in Global Security. It was noted that the ILOs had not been written in line with University Guidelines.

Feedback from the external examiner was supportive and it was noted that '*the quality of criminology provision at the University of Glasgow remains high and is responsive to both student demand and the changing contours of criminology as a discipline*'

The feedback from students was positive particularly with regard to having two assessment points for a course.

The scrutiny group accept the advice from RIO that there is some market potential and expect that the Proposer will work with them to realise this potential.

The Business Plan has been approved by the College Finance Office
