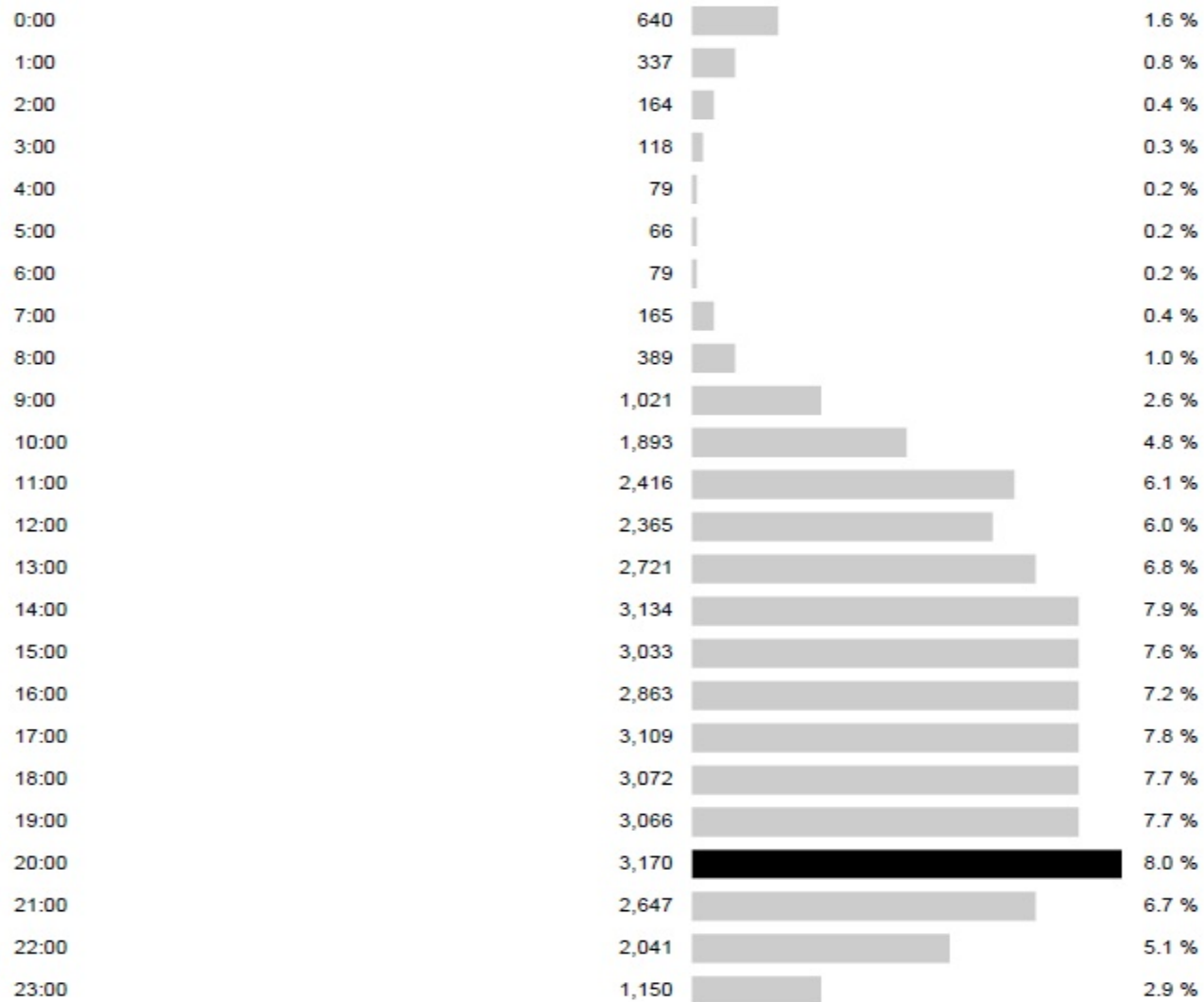

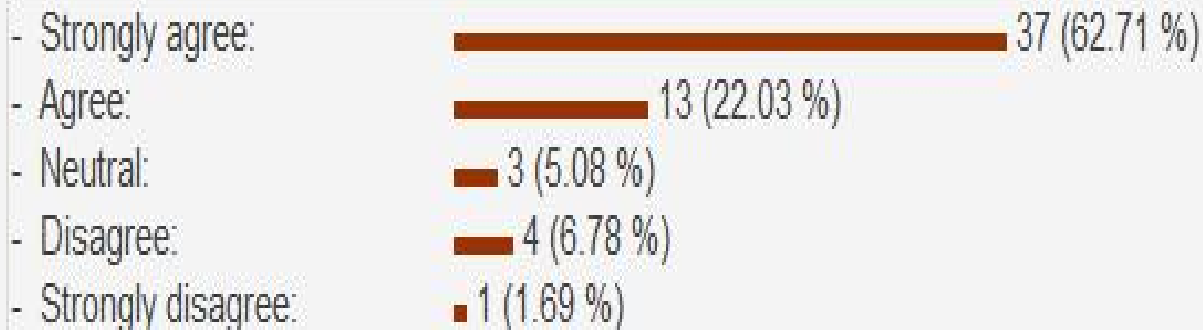

I could easily access the recorded lectures while on clinical practice on Tuesday and Thursday afternoon

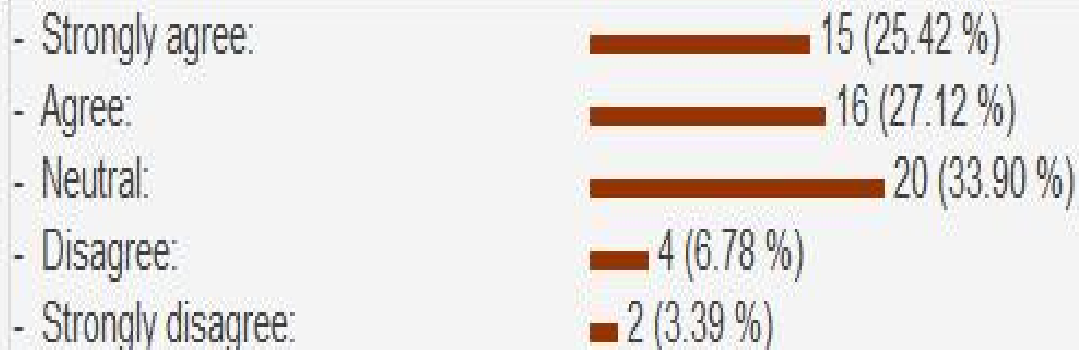

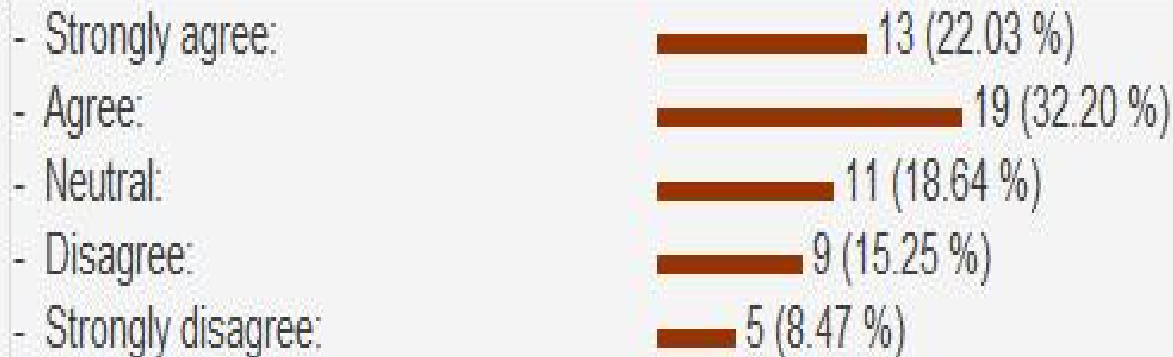

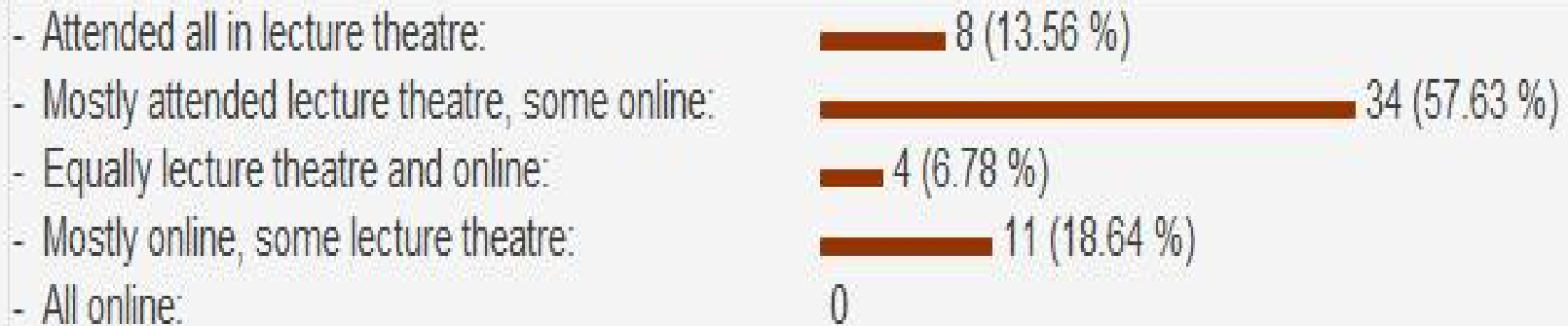
Using lecture capture technology will help me earn higher grades in my exam



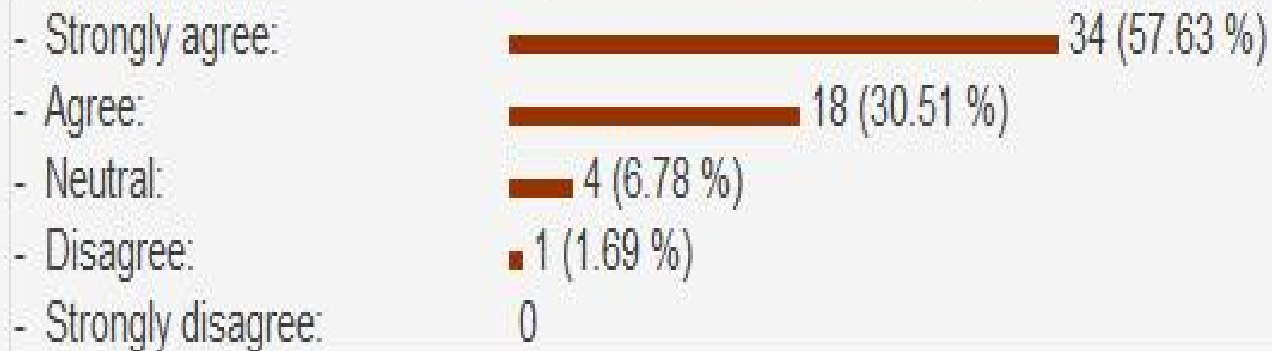
Reviewing lectures with this technology is a good substitute for attending class

“Definitely keep doing the podcasts! Words cannot stress how handy they were in yr 3 and I'd hate to see other years missing out on them!”

“The technology has been a great success and a very valuable tool.”

“I have dyslexia and without the opportunity to review lectures online I feel I would not have been able to keep up with the work expected of me this year. Lecturers tend to speak too fast for me to write anything of worth down on paper.”

“Echo website crashed from time to time and a number of the lectures were not recorded correctly e.g. there was no sound or the picture didn’t synchronise with the sound.”

“Technical issues were very frustrating such as difficulties logging in and accessing lectures, streaming is faulty and skips, returns to the beginning when paused”

“Use of laser pointers should be stopped, they cannot be seen on lecture capture”

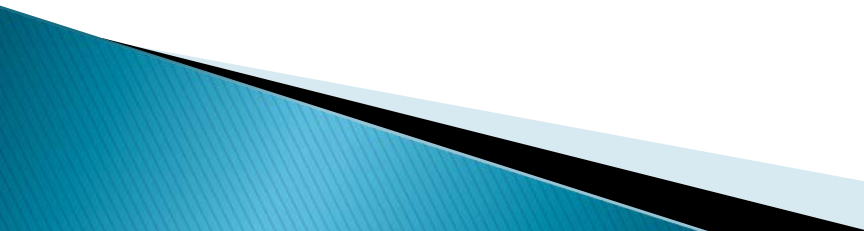
“Make sure the lecturers turn on the microphone”

“Don’t use yellow text on a blue background”

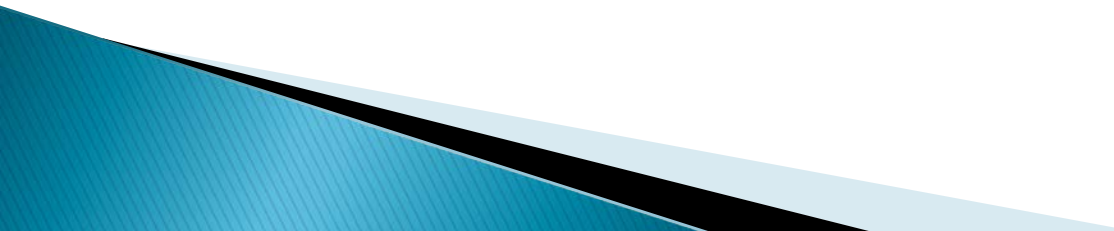
“Ensure lecturers do not use “this is podcast so we can skip past this” as an excuse for letting you read over lectures in your own time”.

“Please be generous with the time given to capture as some lectures were cut short”


Staff response

- ▶ 92% gave permission
 - All of these would give their permission again.
 - Would encourage continued use of lecture capture.
 - ▶ 43% would prefer to edit/review lectures
 - ▶ 80% would like to review lectures for personal development purposes
 - ▶ 31% believe recording lectures affected attendance

Future plans for lecture capture

- ▶ Continue to use lecture capture for MBCChB3
 - ▶ Encourage use of discussion boards for peer assisted learning.
 - ▶ Trial live streaming of lectures
