The IMCEERES multiple degree programme aims to provide students with thorough knowledge and understanding of historical and contemporary developments in the society, politics, economics and culture of Russia and the Post-socialist countries of Central and Eastern Europe and Eurasia.

To this end, the programme is structured to offer a wide variety of options for advanced study of the region's shared Communist past and the ways in which this has shaped - and continues to shape - the dynamics of post-socialist and post-Cold War transformation. The geographical area to be treated by this programme spans therefore across the wider post-socialist world, in a region that encompasses Central & Eastern Europe, Russia, and the newly independent states of the Caucasus and Central Asia.

Degree Structure

Year 1, Semester 1 (University of Tartu)

- Introduction to Central, East European, Russian and Eurasian Studies; Social Science Methodology
- Options include: Conflict Management and Resolution; Political and Social Change; International Relations; Elections and Political Behaviour; Comparative Ethnopolitics
- Language: Czech, Hungarian, Polish and Russian (Estonian as optional module)

Year 1, Semester 2 (University of Glasgow)

Options include (subject to availability):

- Geopolitics of Central and Eastern Europe; Statehood and Nationality in Central and Eastern Europe; Russian Foreign Policy; Post-Soviet Russia: Renegotiating Global and Local Identities; Contested States: The South Caucasus after 1991; Rethinking Central Asian Security; De Facto States in the Post-Soviet Space; Developments in Czech Society since 1989; Media and Democratisation in CEE and the Former Soviet Union
- Language: Czech, Hungarian, Polish and Russian

Year 2, Semester 1 (Partner University)

- Students study abroad at one of the multiple degree partner universities. These mobilities include a credit-bearing placement with NGOs, think-tanks and professional organisations.
- **Language:** options available in the local language of the partner university (Hungarian, Georgian, Polish, Kazakh, Ukrainian and Russian)

Year 2, Semester 2 (Partner University/University of Glasgow/University of Tartu)

- Dissertation writing and research
- Option of fourth mobility (depending on dissertation research needs)
