She is the author of books including *Unmarriages: Women, Men, and Sexual Unions in the Middle Ages*, *Sexuality in Medieval Europe: Doing Unto Others*, and *From Boys to Men: Formations of Masculinity in Later Medieval Europe*. Her co-edited volumes include *The Oxford Handbook of Women and Gender in Medieval Europe*, with Judith Bennett. She is currently President of the Medieval Academy of America, and is a former North American Co-Editor of *Gender and History*.
