Jelena Bekvalac, BA Hons, MSc, FSA is a Curator of Human Osteology at the Centre for Human Bioarchaeology, Museum of London, and has been at the Centre since its establishment with funding from the Wellcome Trust in 2003. Prior to becoming a Curator in 2008, Jelena was a research osteologist within the osteological team based at the Centre and was part of the team for the Wellcome Skeletons: London's Buried Bones exhibition in 2008 and the regional travelling Skeletons exhibitions 2016 -2018. Jelena has worked on archaeological excavations and projects with skeletal remains in England and abroad in Jordan, Russia and the Czech Republic as well as the extraordinary Spitalfields Market excavation. As a curator at the Centre for Human Bioarchaeology, the role is varied and interesting, caring for the extensive skeletal assemblages; working on exhibitions, assisting researchers, participating in outreach events and research projects. The focus of study for last four years being the collaborative research project, The Impact of Industrialisation on London Health. Areas of particular interest include palaeopathology, radiography and post-medieval bioarchaeology.
