# The Challenge

The Glasgow City Region requires significant private investment in public sector projects to meet its net zero targets and respond to the needs of decarbonisation, adaptation and inclusive growth.

Your challenge, as part of a team of 4, is to develop an effective monitoring, reporting and verification (MRV) mechanism for these types of public sector projects. The proposed MRV should align with private sector expectations and mobilise private investment. With these requirements in mind, your team should draw up a 2 page proposal (roughly 1,000 words) outlining the specifications of your MRV.

Proposals should be written in accordance with the Guidance Document. The top 10 finalists will be invited to present their solutions to a panel of employers and academics.



# Eligibility

The challenge is open to undergraduate students at the University of Glasgow. Students are encouraged to form interdisciplinary teams combining knowledge from differing subject areas.

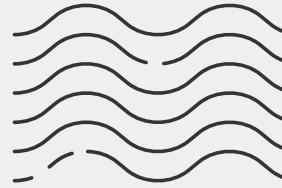
